



# Emergency Manager Competency Assessment (Dealing with Emergencies)

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## Attendees:

The Emergency Manager Competency Assessment course is designed for personnel who are required to formally demonstrate their emergency management skills as an Emergency Manager or Deputy Emergency Manager. Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) and Corporate Emergency Operations Centre (CEOC) personnel who support the Emergency Manager may also attend for assessment as required.

## Course Objective

To provide students with an opportunity to demonstrate competence in managing major emergencies.

## Student Experience and Qualifications Requirements

Attendance and successful completion of the EOC or CEOC course depending on the evaluation required (ECO or CEOC).

## Candidate Assessment Criteria

Students must be able to demonstrate competence, through simulation, in accordance with the following criteria:

- Maintaining a state of readiness
- Assessing the situation
- Taking effective action
- Maintaining communications
- Delegating authority to act
- Managing self and team performance
- Dealing with stress



### **Course Duration and Method of Delivery**

2 or 3 days of practical exercises (subject to numbers).

### **Certification**

Seacom International Certificate. Candidates also receive a written assessment report as well as a video of their performance during the assessment.

### **Minimum Instructor Qualification's / Experience**

- 5 years experience
- 5 years technical teaching experience
- 5 years emergency management experience
- Qualified in assessment

### **Required number of students per course**

2

### **Training Schedule**

0900 to 1700 (Any 2 or 3 consecutive days)

### **Venue**

Internationally or in Canada.

### **Dates & Cost**
